## About Prof.M.D.Nanjundaswamy Adhyana Peeta

The scholar activist Professor MD Nanjundaswamy, was India's leading advocate of farmers' rights, and a vociferous critic of the World Trade Organisation (WTO) and multinational companies in developing countries. Prof M D Nanjundaswamy, a leading architect of the farmers' movement in Karnataka who fought against multinational companies. Nanjundaswamy, a professor of law, played a key role in shaping and strengthening the farmers' movement in the 1980s. He tried to give the movement political muscle by floating the Karnataka State Farmers Association and contesting the assembly polls in the 1980s. He was even elected to the assembly in 1989. Nanjundaswamy battled MNCs, particularly in respect of genetically modified crops, targeting companies like Monsanto and remained a strong critic of the globalisation trend. His contributions to the development of agriculture sector were very impressive and provided a platform for the farmers to raise their voices against such evils.

## About the Conference

As India aims to occupy a strategic position in the world map, an all-round advancement of the economy is crucial. In this backdrop, it is imperative that both the rural and urban economies progress hand in hand. 'Rural India' is where more than half of the country's population actually resides and is a storehouse of numerous resources, which are, however, yet to be fully utilized.
